Since our program's inception in 2005, all students have received a graduate assistantship that may carry an expectation of up to 20 hours/week of work (e.g., as a teaching assistant or research assistant), renewable for up to four years. In addition, students with an assistantship receive a full tuition waiver for up to five years and health insurance coverage. We expect that these programs will continue, unless the state funding picture changes significantly. However, students are always responsible for paying the university fees.
